The treasurer's report was read by David Butler in absence of our treasurer, Erling Voss. We have \$5235.00 on hand. There will be a more detailed report at the annual meeting.

Gordon and Eleanor Mommsen prepared the beautiful lake maps of Half Moon Lake. They are available to anyone who would like one. Shirley Dworsky suggested we leave maps at the businesses in the vicinity.

The Barr Engineering report is complete. The cost was \$13,000. The State of Wisconsin paid \$10,000 and the association paid \$3500. The lake was analyzed twenty years ago and the quality of the water is as good as it was then. David Butler has a complete analysis by Barr Engineering in a book. He has a limited number of copies of the book, so members can sign them out and return them to David after they have read the information.

Half Moon Lake Protection and Rehabilitation District Annual Meeting  
Saturday August 28, 1994 10:00 A.M.  
Half Moon Lake Pavilion

The meeting was called to order by David Butler.

The secretary's report was read. There was one correction. The Polk County Lakes Fair was referred to as the Polk County Fair. After the correction was made the minutes were approved.

The treasurers report was read by Erling Voss.

As of the August 10, 1994 statement there is \$2655.68 in the MMA savings and \$1256.75 in the NOW checking account for a total of \$3912.43.

Erling passed out a summary of all the transactions to everyone present.

Doris Christopherson questioned the beaver removal. David explained why the beavers had to be periodically removed in the Harder Creek area. Kenny Kellogg has to tear the dams down because the water floods the road. Our long range plan is how to control the water level.

Election of Board of Commissioners: David explained the by-laws now provide we have 5 commissioners. One appointed by the county which is Gerald Hanlos. One appointed by the township which is Bruce Christiansen. Wisconsin legislator's changed the law this year stating there can now be 5 commissioners on the association around the lakes. Our group is recommending the by-laws be changed to 5 from 3 elected people on the board. A motion was made to have by-laws ammended to change the number of Board of Commissioners from 3 to 5. It was approved unnanomously by a show of hands. One commissioner must be a resident of the lake. Sherm Gardner will be the nominee as the commissioner who is a resident of lake, for a 3 year term. Erling Voss was unable to serve another term because he has moved from the lake. David thanked Erling for all of the work he has done on the board. The other two nominees are Dana Gautier (2 years) and Art Mc Mahon Jr. (3 years) A motion was made and seconded to accept the commissioners.

Kent Banks gave a summary of the Barr Engineering report. Kent talked about the quality of the water. David suggested to sign out the book Barr Engineering has put together for us.

Sherm Gardner gave a report on what he has been doing this summer in addition to the Barr Engineering program. It is administered through the State Conservation Dept. Lake associations who participate are provided with equipment and free testing. Sherm is the delegated representative for this.

Phil Siegle reported on the lake area cleanup. We have had a cleanup of the lake area for the past two years. Phil noted the dumpster was already full. We will need to order another dumpster. This clean up was really intended to clean up around the lake and not for everyone's junk. The price to discard a car tire is \$2.00, truck tire \$5.00, tractor tire \$10.00 Refrigerator or air conditioner \$25.00. (because of freon ) This is what it costs the lake assn. to dispose of it. We are requesting everyone to be on the honor system. You can write a check to David and he will

give it to the new treasurer. The board will have to reconsider what to do next year if it is used for the other neighbors as a dumpster. We are not sure we are accomplishing what we wanted to. It is costing approximately \$1.00 per home owner. It was suggested perhaps people would just throw the junk in the ditches if we did not have it.

Gerald Hanlos explained zoning laws. To build closer than 75 ft to the lake you must get an approval from the board of adjustments.

Shirley Dworsky reported on the 1995 all lake picnic. It was suggested by the committee it should be held on the same day as the assn meeting. We voted on the month to have the picnic June, July or August? It was decided to have the picnic and annual meeting in the middle of August. David thanked Shirley for all of her good work.

Martha Mc Mahon commented on the writing of the history of the lake. We are still planning to have a book on the history of Half Moon Lake.

Gordy Munson reported on the buffer zone around the lake. He gave a history of the study on the wetlands and how valuable they are to keep the quality of the lake. Gordy passed maps out with the importance around the lake.

Phase II of Barr Engineering will show the cost of improvement. Study potentially will show everything that is necessary to apply to the State of Wisc. for a grant. The board is recommending to go ahead with the study to identify which wetlands are the most important. We would like to start so it would be ready in time to be submitted to the DNR for grant purposes. We want to preserve what we have in the wetlands now on the lake through various tools.

Ken Sahlstrom questioned the cost of the second phase by Barr Engineering. David stated it would be \$3500 from the assn and \$10,000 from the state. David asked approval to of the \$3500 expenditure for the next study. It was approved by a show of hands.

David read a letter from John Wolf, offering his services to help in the study with the help of Marvin Turner, who is a retired employee of the U.S. Park Services from St Croix, at a much less fee. The board will take this up at the next commissioners meeting.

The budget was presented: \$1000 for lake maps, telephone calls and operating expenses. \$3500 for lake study. \$2000 for future land acquisitions. (we are starting to build a fund) There is now \$4000 in the treasury. The budget will be \$6500 this year. It was first, seconded and approved.

David requested we sign up if any one would like to be on the advisory board from the people around the lake.

The meeting was adjourned at 11:31.

**Half Moon Lake Protection and Rehabilitation District  
Report to Commissioners  
November 23, 1994**

It doesn't look as though we will be able to have a meeting of the Board of Commissioners before the first of the year so I thought I would give you a report as to what has been going on. I report the following:

1. I have been meeting with Jon Lennander of Barr Engineering in preparation of the application for our next study grant. This grant will be geared toward establishing a rationale and a plan for acquisition of easements to protect the wetland and bog areas. The application has to be in by February 1, 1995.
2. We found that we had not received our last \$2,000 payment from the State on the first grant so we are in the process of filing our request for payment for the balance of the funds from that grant program.
3. We have notified the township clerk of our request for \$6,500 from the next tax levy. We will receive half of these funds in March, 1995 and half near the end of 1995.
4. I met the new supervisor of the Balsam Lake Branch Watershed District at the last meeting of the Advisory Committee. Sherm Gardner also attended the meeting held in Balsam Lake.
5. We have been in touch with the president of the Polk County Association of Lakes and have advised them to put Sherm Gardner and Art McMahon on their mailing list.
6. Sherm Gardner reports that the board has been taken out of the dam and no beavers have moved into the Harder Creek area so there is nothing we need to do in regard to exterminating more beavers this fall.
7. I will be in touch with Shirley Dworsky about the August 12 picnic. I would like to see us consider having some demonstration projects at the picnic such as ideas for creating buffer zones along the lake front, demonstrations on types of fertilizer that should be used on lawns and ideas about building shore bank protection from field rock and rip rap.
8. I will plan to get out a newsletter in 1995.
9. I will be in touch with Rick Cornelius of the DNR concerning plans for stocking walleye in 1995. I also plan to be in touch with the biologist from the St. Croix Chippewa Tribal Fish Hatchery concerning their stocking of walleye in 1995.
10. I have had discussions with Bob Wilson, Park Director for Polk County, and with Jeff Timmons, Manager of the Polk County Land

Conservation Department, concerning the county's willingness to hold the easements that we might acquire in the future. The county is reviewing the matter to determine what their participation might be.

11. Bob and Steve McMahon have agreed to prepare a report on the bog areas that can be a part of the Barr Engineering study. They have walked the areas extensively and are familiar with the flora and fauna in the area.
12. Martha McMahon and Art McMahon are proceeding with their accumulation of historical data with the idea of publishing a history of Half Moon Lake.
13. I have talked with Jack Wolf, retire appraiser who lives on the north end of Half Moon Lake. He had written to me offering his services as an appraiser for acquiring easements. I told him we were not in a position to do anything yet but we would talk to him at a later time.
14. I have talked with some of the people in the county courthouse concerning the availability of field rock for use in building up banks along the shorelines. There is some possibility of building up an inventory of farmers who may have rocks available if lake shore property owners want to acquire the rocks themselves and build up their own banks. Otherwise, there are contractors available who can perform the service. We need to look at alternatives so that we do the best job possible in building up our lake shore around the lake. I visited my old lake of Clear Lake, Iowa a few weeks ago and was dismayed to see so many cement walls having been constructed around the lake. I think the DNR feels strongly that these cement walls are very destructive in that they cut out all migration of animal life in and out of the water. We need to be cognizant of that as we help people decide on what type of shore bank protection is best.
15. Sherm Gardner is continuing to take samples of water from the lake to determine the clarity and the quality of the water. Samples are being forwarded to the DNR lab for analysis. This is being done under the DNR self-help program.
16. I have met with Gary Spidel, Administrator of the Polk County Zoning Commission. He feels there is nothing that can be done under the present zoning laws to monitor contractors as they build new properties around the lake. He said there would need to be a change in the zoning ordinance that would require a contractor to obtain a building permit before excavation was carried on that might affect the lake. At the present time, the only thing we can do is monitor contractors as they are building in the area and encourage them to be cautious so that no materials are disposed of into the lake and run off is kept to a minimum.




17. I have written to David Anderson Construction about the matter of not dumping waste water into the lake during construction projects.

Erling Voss was unable to serve another term because he has moved from the lake. David thanked Erling for all of the work he has done on the board. The other two nominees are Dana Gautier (2 years) and Art Mc Mahon Jr. (3 years) A motion was made and seconded to accept the commissioners.

Kent Banks gave a summary of the Barr Engineering report. Kent talked about the quality of the water. David suggested to sign out the book Barr Engineering has put together for us.

Sherm Gardner gave a report on what he has been doing this summer in addition to the Barr Engineering program. It is administered through the State Conservation Dept. Lake associations who participate are provided with equipment and free testing. Sherm is the delegated representative for this.

Phil Siegle reported on the lake area cleanup. We have had a cleanup of the lake area for the past two years. Phil noted the dumpster was already full. We will need to order another dumpster. This clean up was really intended to clean up around the lake and not for everyone's junk. The price to discard a car tire is \$2.00, truck tire \$5.00, tractor tire \$10.00 Refrigrator or air conditioner \$25.00. (because of freon ) This is what it costs the lake assn. to dispose of it. We are requesting everyone to be on the honor system. You can write a check to David and he will



give it to the new treasurer. The board will have to reconsider what to do next year if it is used for the other neighbors as a dumpster. We are not sure we are accomplishing what we wanted to. It is costing approximately \$1.00 per home owner. It was suggested perhaps people would just throw the junk in the ditches if we did not have it.

Gerald Hanlos explained zoning laws. To build closer than 75 ft to the lake you must get an approval from the board of adjustments.

Shirley Dworsky reported on the 1995 all lake picnic. It was suggested by the committee it should be held on the same day as the assn meeting. We voted on the month to have the picnic June, July or August? It was decided to have the picnic and annual meeting in the middle of August. David thanked Shirley for all of her good work.

Martha Mc Mahon commented on the writing of the history of the lake. We are still planning to have a book on the history of Half Moon Lake.

Gordy Munson reported on the buffer zone around the lake. He gave a history of the study on the wetlands and how valuable they are to keep the quality of the lake. Gordy passed maps out with the importance around the lake.

Phase II of Barr Engineering will show the cost of improvement. Study potentially will show everything that is necessary to apply to the State of Wisc. for a grant. The board is recommending to go ahead with the study to identify which wetlands are the most important. We would like to start so it would be ready in time to be submitted to the DNR for grant purposes. We want to preserve what we have in the wetlands now on the lake through various tools.

Ken Sahlstrom questioned the cost of the second phase by Barr Engineering. David stated it would be \$3500 from the assn and \$10,000 from the state. David asked approval to of the \$3500 expenditure for the next study. It was approved by a show of hands.

David read a letter from John Wolf, offering his services to help in the study with the help of Marvin Turner, who is a retired employee of the U.S. Park Services from St Croix, at a much less fee. The board will take this up at the next commissioners meeting.

The budget was presented: \$1000 for lake maps, telephone calls and operating expenses. \$3500 for lake study. \$2000 for future land acquisitions. (we are starting to build a fund) There is now \$4000 in the treasury. The budget will be \$6500 this year. It was first, seconded and approved.

David requested we sign up if any one would like to be on the advisory board from the people around the lake.

The meeting was adjourned at 11:31.

MEMO            Half Moon Lake

I talked with Rick Cornelius in the DNR office in Barron on June 22, 1994. He said the St. Croix tribe biologist is Beth Greiff. She is in Hertel, Wisconsin at 715-349-2195. He said that the Indians speared 30 walleyes in 1994 plus 14 other fish. He said their quota was 110. He said if they did no spearing at all, the bag limit on Half Moon Lake would be 5. He said that if the Indians did any spearing, the bag limit is reduced to 3. As long as the Indians do not take more than 60 walleyes, the bag limit stays at 3. If they were to have opted to take more walleyes, the bag limit would have been zero. The Indians could have taken 110 under the present quota. He felt the Indians made an attempt to stay within the allotted numbers so the bag limit would not be reduced to less than 3.

He said the DNR will be doing a fish count in the fall.

The DNR did some fish stocking last year and will again do some in 1994. They plan to put in 28,950 fingerlings. He said they still have not determined the effect of the stocking. He said a walleye fingerling should reach the 15 inch length in 4 to 5 years.

He said that walleye spawning grounds are sometimes covered over with siltation. He said in his opinion, however, the rock and the sand in the Half Moon Lake area still looks good. He said another theory is that the bass as they produce crowd out the walleye. He said that has happened on a lot of other lakes. He said Half Moon Lake had no walleye prior to 1930 when they started stocking. He said it may be that the lake is just returning to its state before they started the stocking.

I asked about walleye spawning in the creeks and he thought it might have happened but it would have been insignificant in terms of numbers.

He said the Indians stocking the 5 to 6 inch walleyes was a fluke because they happen to have had extras in their spawning ponds and it probably will not happen again. He thought that the Bureau of Indian Affairs probably has funds that does most of the funding for the Indians stocking program. He said there was money from the gambling casinos going into the Indian tribes but he hadn't heard of any money going into the walleye stocking program.

HALF MOON LAKE PAVILION

We opened the meeting with a demonstration of how water is taken from the lake for water analysis from Sherm Gardner. He stated Half Moon Lake is considered a very clear lake in the area. It has the most clear water in the area with the exception of Deer Lake.

David Butler explained the purpose of the spring meeting. It is an informational meeting only. The annual meeting held in August is the meeting we will vote on issues.

Bev. Hoium read the minutes from the General Meeting held August 28, 1993.

David Butler discussed the boating regulations. He stated Warren Smallidge was correct on the 100' distance parallel to the shoreline when operating a motor boat at high speed. The board of commissioners had suggested 200'. We will abide by the rules of the State of Wisconsin.

The treasurer's report was read by David Butler in absence of our treasurer, Erling Voss. We have \$5235.00 on hand. There will be a more detailed report at the annual meeting.

He talked on how important it is to preserve the wetlands. There is nothing concrete as what we should do. The most important one is Harder Creek. We are looking at grant money for this project.

It was decided to have a lake clean-up on August 27 to August 29, 1994. It will cost \$20.00 for a appliance which is not part of the clean-up project.

Walt Gretsfield gave a fishing report. The Indians <sup>have</sup> ~~were to~~ put in 3000 walleyes. 5"-6" fingerlings. They removed 63 spear fishing. The biggest walleye speared was 5 lbs.

There is <sup>1.5</sup> ~~one~~ adult walleye per acre now. Ten years ago there was three adult walleyes per acre.

The meeting was adjourned at 11:15 A.M.

**Addendum to Minutes of the  
Board of Commissioners  
May 14, 1994**

After the adjournment of the meeting, the Wetland Committee met with Ed Slaminski of the DNR and we walked the Harder Creek area, the Tamarack Bay area and the Bog area. The general conclusion of Ed Slaminski was that the beavers in the Harder Creek area had created a very good situation in creating holding ponds. He didn't see any reason to change what we now have. We talked about digging out a holding pond area north of Harder Creek and he said that the DNR was not encouraging that kind of a siltation holding pond because when you went into the area to talk out the silt, it stirred up a lot of silt and that then ran into the lake and so it was counterproductive. We talked about raising the level of Dow Road where it crosses Harder Creek so that the water level could be kept up to its present level without impeding traffic on Dow Road. We need to explore this possibility further with Milltown Township.

Ed Slaminski said that he was not concerned with development on the higher levels of the exteriors of the Harder Creek area. He felt the development in those higher areas would not cause problems with the creek. His concern was with the actual creek bed area and he felt that it would be wise to obtain easements restricting any developments in that area.

Richard <sup>Kaiser</sup>~~Geiser~~ met with us and led us through the Harder Creek area. He advised us that he would not allow any further dynamiting of the beaver dams. We tried to assure him that we had no intent of doing that again. Apparently the township had done that a few years ago with the approval of the DNR. At that time, silt ran into the lake after the dynamiting had occurred. <sup>Kaiser</sup>~~Geiser~~ was quite upset that we had allowed people to shoot some of the beaver and he said that we would not be able to get the trapper to do any further work for us. Erling Voss said he knew of someone who would be willing to trap the beaver for us at no cost because the cost of the pelts has started to go up.

We also met with Dick Mc<sup>C</sup>lain. He showed us the area of the creek where it goes through his property. The dams on his property are much smaller than the big dam on <sup>Kaiser</sup>~~Geiser~~'s property. He said that walleyes are suckers used to come up the stream years ago before the beaver dams were built.

I had the idea of acquiring title to all of the Harder Creek area and putting a walking path on each side of the creek.

We discussed who would own the property, the Lake Association, the Township, the County or the State. Ed Slaminski said that the state would probably not be interested in acquiring this small tract of property. I need to check with the county to see if they

have any park commission that would be interested in acquiring this kind of property for a park.

I need to talk to Dana Gaultier about Ed Slaminski's comments about the siltation pond.

We went over to the Tamarack Bay area. It was raining so we did not get to walk much of it. Don Nelson, a property owner, showed us around his property. He said that he didn't think there was much runoff from the Millburg farm. There are two small creeks that run into Tamarack Bay. He said there are springs in the area which bring up clear water that then runs into Tamarack Bay. He said walleye used to come up into Tamarack Bay and spawn in the creeks. He said there was an opening 100 ft. wide at one time where boaters could go back into Tamarack Bay. He said this was filled up when a piece of a bog got loose and the property owners put it back into place and it eventually filled in that waterway area.

We then looked at the bog area, also called Disaster Bay. Ed Slaminski was quite impressed with this area. On the north side, there has been some placement of sand and gravel. It looks like someone might have at one time thought of doing a development on the north side of the area. I need to check and see how far Baldwin's property line goes in this area. His concern was that someone could get permission to do some filling and build a lot and then do a board walkway from the development to the lake through the bog. He said he thought this should be the first priority for us in terms of acquisition. He thought we should buy up the whole bog area. I asked him about putting a board walk around the area and he thought that would be a good idea so that people could use it without damaging the area. I need to check further on the layout, the ownership and the value.

We drove by the Bev Hoium family's property and decided that would be low on the priority. It doesn't look like there is much chance for a development in any of that area.

I need to talk with Jon Lennander about the Barr Engineering report. I would like to specifically know what the tests were of the water samples taken from the runoff of Harder Creek. Someone at the meeting stated they thought there was an outlet from Antler Lake into Harder Creek.

Gordy Mommsen is concerned about the runoff north of G through the culvert and into the lake next to his property. After looking at it, however, he decided there is probably not much to be done in that area.

I need to talk with Carl Lindquist concerning the farms in the Half Moon Lake area.

I need to talk with the county about replacement for Ray Bauerfield.

I need to talk with Bruce Christensen about the Harder Creek area and start discussions about the road.

I need to check on the Milltown records to determine how much of the valuation in the Milltown township comes from the owners around Half Moon Lake.

I need to talk to Jim Smith about the July 9 picnic.

I need to talk to Erling Voss about whether he wants to stay on the commission for another 3 years.

I need to talk to Jon Lennander about getting the Barr Engineering report in time for the June 11 meeting.

I need to talk to Sherm Gardner about overseeing the beaver population.
